BC RESOLUTION 07-25-12-B Autonomous Human Resource Structure and Reporting

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section I of the Oneida Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, BC resolution # 5-12-93-J makes the Human Resources Department responsible for the interpretation, notification, and enforcement of the Oneida Personnel Policies and Procedures while ensuring and enforcing compliance throughout the Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Human Resources Department is responsible for all employment and labor related matters which are under Gaming, non-Gaming and non-Divisional operations, and

WHEREAS, two (2) internal audits have identified the Human Resources Department is subject to a conflict of interest when directly supervised by a manager at the Division Director/General Manager levels of management, and

WHEREAS, the Human Resources Department needs to operate independently and autonomous of all divisional and non-divisional entities or employees,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Human Resources Department is moved structurally under the Oneida Business Committee, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the direct supervision of the Human Resource Manager is the responsibility of the Chairman or the Vice-Chairman in the Chairman's absence, and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that this report change is considered a priority of the Government and the transition of the current Human Resources Department organizational structure be completed within thirty (30) days.
