
Fee to Trust Resolution for Sugar Maple Lane Property

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has be delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as: Sugar Maple Lane Property
- WHEREAS,** the parcels is described as follows: Lot Six (6) according to the recorded Plat of Pierquet Parc, said Plat being part of Lot 12, Morris and Bromely's subdivision of the South ½ of Private Claim 13, West side of Fox River, in the City of Green Bay, Brown County, Wisconsin, lying East of the Fourth Principal Meridian. Tax Parcel No. 6H-3655
Lot Thirty-two (32), according to the recorded Plat of Woodland Trails Third Addition, said plat being a part of Government Lot Three (3), Section Thirty-three (33), Township Twenty-four (24) North, Range Twenty (20) East, in the Fourth Principal Meridian, in the City of Green Bay, West side of Fox River, Brown County, Wisconsin. Tax Parcel No. 6H-4088
- WHEREAS,** the above described parcel is requested in Trust Status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide a future site for economic development, housing, recreation, conservancy, and agriculture, and)

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests that the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs to initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcels in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.
