- WHEREAS, Forest Lee House has formally signed relinquishment of membership documents, requesting that his name be stricken from the rolls of the Oneida Tribe, and that he expressly waives any and all benefits and rights now existing or which may accure.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Committee in <u>hequian</u> session assembled, hereby approves the relinquishment of membership with the Oneida Tribe as requested by Forrest Lee House.
