
Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin

RESOLUTION 8-07-96-D

WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribe Constitution by the Oneida General Council, and

WHEREAS, under the constitution of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, the Oneida Business Committee is charges with the duty of protecting and enhancing the health, security, economic and general welfare and advancement of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and

TEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin's Department of Public rks is responsible for providing and maintenance service on tribal roads; and

WHEREAS, Tribal roads need to be put on the Bureau of Indians Affairs Reservation Roads System Inventory to qualify for Bureau of Indians Affairs Road Construction and Maintenance funds;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin intend to transfer road rights-of-way for this Vandewalle housing project, a parcel of land, 66 feed wide, located in Indian claims 18, 128 and 129, in the northwest quarter of the southwest quarter of section 4, township 23 north, range 19 east, Outagamie County, Wisconsin.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin grants a lifetime easement to the Bureau of Indians Affairs for the above named rights-of-way free of compensation.
