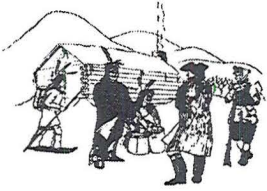


Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin

Resolution 08-10-11-A Affordable Care Act Tribal Personal Responsibility Education Program for Teen Pregnancy Prevention

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated authority under Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has determined that the overall goal of the Oneida Tribe is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and
- WHEREAS,** our vision is a *nation of strong families built on Tsi?Niyukwliho T^ (Our Ways) and a strong economy*, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe seeks to provide a positive foundation for youth, encouraging healthy life skills and supporting personal responsibility education, in an effort to prevent teen pregnancy and sexually transmitted diseases, through abstinence, contraception and adulthood preparation, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin authorizes and submits a grant application to the Administration for Children and Families for the Affordable Care Act Tribal Personal Responsibility Education Program for Teen Pregnancy Prevention (HHS-2011-ACR-ACYF-AT-0157).
