RESOLUTION # 8-18-93B

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, to manage all the economic affairs and enterprises of the Oneida Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as:

Vanden Eng Property

A parcel of land located in the Southwest 1/4 of the Southwest 1/4, the Northwest 1/4 of the Southwest 1/4, the Northeast 1/4 of the Northwest 1/4, all in Section 25 and part of the Southwest 1/4 and the Southwest 1/4 of the Northwest 1/4, all in Section 25 and part of the Southwest 1/4 of the Southwest 1/4 of Section 26 and Government Lots: 21, 22 and 23 in Section 26, all in Township 23 North, Range 18 East, Town of Oneida, Outagamie County, Wiscomsin, bounded and described as follows: Commencing at the North 1/4 corner of Section 25; thence S 00°09′14°E, 50.01 feet along the East line of the Northwest 1/4 of Section 25 to the South right-of-way line of C.T.H. "EE" and the point of Beginning; thence continuing S 00°09′14°E, 2584.48 feet along said East line to the center of Section 25; thence S 88°32′01°W, 1311.95 feet along the East-West 1/4 line of Section 25 to the East line of the West 1/2 of the Southwest 1/4 of Section 25; thence S 00°21′50°E, 1782.35 feet along said East line to the North line of lands described in Volume 770, page 627; thence S 89°22′29°W, 467.97 feet (recorded as S 89°41′E, 467.36 feet) along aid North line; thence N 49°33′54°W, 632.23 feet (recorded as S 49°42′E 646.25 feet) along a North-easterly line of said described lands; thence S 88°54′32°W, 654.13 feet (recorded as N 89°58′E, 635.05 feet) along the North line of said described lands; thence S 34°21′03°W, 879.90 feet (recorded as N 35°29′E 879.60 feet) along the Northwesterly line of said described lands; thence S 89°00′31°W, 532.87 feet along said South line to the Southeast 1/4 of Section 26; thence S 88°90′31°W, 532.87 feet along said South line to the Southeast 1/4 of Section 26; thence N 89°02′22°E, 1321.51 feet along the Northwest corner of the Southeast 1/4 of the Southeast 1/4 of Section 26; thence N 89°02′22°E, 1321.51 feet along the Northwest 1/4 of Section 25; thence N 00°21′17°E, 109.39 feet along said West line; thence N 88°35′06°E, 669.92 feet; thence N 00°35′43°E, 63.49 feet to the Northwest 1/4 of Section 25; t

WHEREAS, the above described parcel is requested in trust status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide a future site for economic development, housing, recreation, conservation, and agriculture, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs to initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcel in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.
