RESOLUTION # 8-22-84-A

- WHEREAS: The Oneida Tribe has assumed the responsibility to implement the Indian Child Welfare Act of 1978; and,
- WHEREAS: The Act requires that the Tribe vest authority over child custody proceedings in a Tribal Court or any other administrative body; and,
- WHEREAS: The OneidanTribe of Indians of Wisconsin is without a Tribal Court.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Oneida Child Protective Board be the administrative body vested with authority over child custody proceedings; and,

BE IT BURTHER RESOLVED:

That the following two tribal members be appointed to the Oneida Child Protective Board for a period of two years, commencing on the date this resolution is approved.
