WHEREAS, The act requires that the Tribe vest authority over child custody Proceedings in Tribal Court or any other administrative body, and

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe is without a Tribal Court

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Child Protective Board be the administrative body vested with authority over child custody proceeding, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the following tribal members be appointed to the Oneida Child Protective Board for a period of four (4) years, commencing on the date this resolution is approved.
