BC Resolution 08-28-13-E Regarding Pardon of Tyler Pamanet

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1, of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Pardon and Forgiveness Screening Committee reviewed the pardon application of Tyler Pamanet at a duly called hearing held on August 15, 2013, and
- WHEREAS,** the requirements of the Pardon and Forgiveness Law have been fulfilled.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee by this resolution hereby:

- Approves the pardon of Tyler Pamanet for the crime(s) of 1. Possession of Marijuana-1st Offense and 2. Theft, and notifies the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin and its agencies that he is recognized as a member of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin to have all the benefits and opportunities available to all other persons as if the criminal offenses(s) pardoned by this resolution did not exist. The pardon has been approved based on the following:
1. List of reasons for approving the pardon per 5.9-3.
 - Paid fines
 - Had record expunged
 - Has a conditional gaming license
- Denies the pardon of **Name**, for the crime(s) of _____, and notifies **him/her** that **she/he** may request another pardon after one (1) year from the date of certification of this document. The pardon has been denied based on the following:
