

RESOLUTION # 09-02-98-C

The Oneida Health Center and the Oneida Domestic Abuse Program Grant Resolution

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governmental body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the goal of the Oneida Tribe is to protect, maintain, and promote self-sufficiency and self reliance by providing health services for Oneida Tribal members, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe through the Oneida Community Health Center and the Oneida Domestic Abuse Program, would like to provide culturally sensitive awareness training for Oneida Community Health Practitioners and Service Providers, Domestic Abuse Staff and the Oneida Police Department in the areas of Domestic and Sexual Abuse, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe believes that the Oneida Family and Community will be strengthened by providing awareness training that will have a positive impact on delivery of health and community services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin-Oneida Community Health Center and the Oneida Domestic Abuse Program authorizes and submits this grant application to the Wisconsin Department of Justice Assistance/Wisconsin Violence Against Women Act for the purpose of providing domestic violence medical system and awareness training.
