

RESOLUTION # 9-06-00-L REGARDING PARDON OF <u>VERNON LEE SMITH</u>

WHEREAS. the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS. the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV., Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Screening Committee has presented a Pardon Petition on behalf of Vernon Lee Smith, and

WHEREAS, the requirements of the Oneida Pardon Ordinance and Oneida Pardon Procedures Policy have been fulfilled, and

the Oneida Screening Committee hereby recommends <u>DENYING</u> the WHEREAS. pardon petition of <u>Vernon Lee Smith</u>, Petitioner.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: The Oneida Business Committee by this resolution hereby:

DENIES the Pardon of Vernon Lee Smith Petitioner, and notifies the Petitioner that he/she may request another pardon after one (1) year from the date of certification of this document.
