Whereas, President Nixon indicated in his speech of July 18, 1970 on Indian policy, self determination for Tribes and

Whereas, The National Tribal Chairman's Association was organized bedause of and enco raged by Presidents Nixon's self dertermination concept, and

Whereas, Self determination needs to spring from the grassroots level, and

Whereas, it is necessary to reach and ment the needs of all Tribes regardless of State and region, and

Whereas, the variations in state laws cause a multitude of problems to Indian Tribes regionally,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Indian Tribes within a specific state have the option of organizing a state level branch of the National Tribal Chairman's Association and the state problems identified by such a state branch be dealt with from a federal level.
