BC Resolution # 09-09-09-B

Reserving Chapters under the Oneida Code of Laws for the New York Lands

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the General Tribal Council; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe may need to adopt particular laws in connection with the lands the Tribe may obtain as part of a Land Claim Settlement with the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, the Legislative Operating Committee is recommending setting aside chapters for the purpose of organizing the laws which would govern any of the Tribe's land in New York; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee supports the LOC recommendation as an official demonstration of the Tribe's commitment to developing the necessary laws in connection with a Land Claim Settlement with the State of New York.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Chapters 200 to 220 of the Oneida Code of Laws shall be set aside for the purpose of containing the laws the Tribe may adopt pursuant to any Land Claim Settlement with the State of New York.
