RESOLUTION 9-13-95-C

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian

government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States,

and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is a governing body of the Oneida

Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of

Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida

General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is developing it's capability to

protect it's cultural resources and develop it's lands and natural resources,

and

WHEREAS, the assessment and management of the tribe's natural resource assets

requires modern Geographic Information Systems (G.I.S.) technology, and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has begun a significant, cost effective, and

responsive investment in G.I.S. as a necessary element of its trust

responsibility, through the Geographic Data Service Center, and

WHEREAS, this service and the personal investment in technology support to tribes, is

threatened by recent budget cuts, potential dislocation and even possible

termination of the Data Service Center.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Business Committee hereby calls for the following:

Maintenance of the federal investment in G.I.S. support through restoration of budget cuts.

2. Maintenance of the Data Service Center in its current location and current program of services.

3. Fulfillment of the administration's promise of full consultation with tribes by withholding any Geographic Data Service Center budget decisions until full consultation with tribes and the Intertribal G.I.S. Council.
