

RESOLUTION # 9-18-92-A

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe is a sovereign nation and is declaring the goals of the Oneida people, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida people are a proud and progressive nation and recognize it's membership as it's greatest natural resource, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has made tremendous progress in preserving and improving the quality of life for it's members, and
- WHEREAS, 1992 is a year of national recognition for the accomplishments and contributions of the indigenous people.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee declares that October 1992 October 1993 be the "Year of the Oneida Nation", and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe will promote and communicate to it's membership the continued responsibility to maintain and improve the quality of life for the next seven generation, and
- BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the elected leadership and administration of the Oneida Tribe will work cooperatively to enhance the communications of this declaration to the Oneida Tribal membership.
