

RESOLUTION NO. 9-18-96-E

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, Colin Jordan, #2915, a tribal member and Ann Jordan, a non-tribal member, residing at 3003 Standing Stone Drive, Oneida, WI 54155, has submitted an application for a long-term lease for residential purposes, more particularly described as follows: RL-2802(96)

Lot 10, according to the unrecorded plat of Standing Stone Subdivision being a part of Indian Claim 151 and 147, Section 3, T23N., R19E., Town of Hobart, Brown County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by this Committee in regular session assembled, hereby requests the Superintendent, Great Lakes Agency, to review and approve the lease in accordance with the Act of August 9, 1955 (69 Stat. 539), as amended, 25 U.S.C. 415, for the above-described land with a 25-year term which shall automatically and without notice renew for an additional term of 25 years, annual rent due at ½ fair market rental, to be determined by an appraisal and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairwoman and Secretary of the Oneida Business Committee are hereby authorized to execute lease documents for and on behalf of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.
