






Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.

## RESOLUTION # <u>09-23-98-A</u> National Historical publications and Records Commission Resolution

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section I of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation, has, as one of its highest priorities, the preservation of the Oneida history, culture and language, and

WHEREAS, the goal to produce and publish "A Photo History of the Oneida Nation of Wisconsin" may be accomplished through a grant from the National Historical Publications and Records Commission, and

whereas, the researching, accumulating, documenting and organizing of documents and photographs will require two years of work and gathering from the respective institutional collections, and

WHEREAS, the production of the book and the microfilming of all documents will occur in year 2 of the project, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation Cultural and Heritage Department now has lead staff to direct and support such a project, but requires additional funds for a research assistant and data entry clerk, as well as, equipment for reproduction and proper storage, and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:** that the Oneida Business Committee fully supports this project and the correspondent application for funding in the amount of \$300,000.00 over a two year period beginning on February 1, 1999.
