BC Resolution 09-24-14-N Appointing Representative to the Great Lakes Inter-Tribal Council

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin: and

WHEREAS, the General Tribal Council has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section I of the Oneida Tribal Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee may be delegated duties and responsibilities by the Oneida General Tribal Council and is at all times subject to the review powers of the Oneida General Tribal Council; and

WHEREAS, the Great Lakes Inter-Tribal Council, Inc. (GLITC) supports member tribes in expanding self-determination efforts by providing services and assistance and uses a broad range of knowledge and experience to advocate for the improvement and unity of tribal governments, communities, and individuals: and

WHEREAS, GLITC's strength lies in the resolve of the tribes to be independent and self-governing, yet to come together in a unified forum to discuss and resolve those issues that require intertribal unity and attention; and

WHEREAS, GLITC supplements the member tribes' own efforts through development and operation of health and human service programs, education programs, and economic development programs in the reservation communities it serves. Intergovernmental relations and policy decisions find an intertribal discussion forum through GLITC;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Oneida Business Committee hereby appoints Cristina Danforth, Chairwoman, as the Tribe's representative on the Great Lakes Intertribal Council.
