

Resolution Adopting Vehicle Fleet Management Policy

- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of the Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the General Tribal Council has been delegated the authority of the Constitution of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee may be delegated duties and responsibilities by the Oneida General Tribal Council and is at all times subject to the review powers of the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Vehicle Fleet Management Policy was developed by the Department of Public Works to identify and manage the vehicles owned and operated by the Oneida Tribe in the interest of safety of the driver and the public, as well as maintaining an asset of the Oneida Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the Vehicle Fleet Management Policy has been presented at the required Public Hearing, the comments submitted have been reviewed, and changed have been made based on that review, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the attached Vehicle Fleet Management Policy is hereby adopted and shall be implemented on October 1, 1997, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Department of Public Works and the Fleet Manager shall work with the Human Resources Department training staff to inform all appropriate employees of the procedures involved within the policy prior to the implementation date of the policy, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the policy shall be forwarded to the Division Directors who shall be responsible for forwarding the policy to all appropriate personnel within their Divisions.
