RESOLUTION # <u>9-26-01-A</u> Section 103 Air Quality U.S. Environmental Protection Agency

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has determined that the overall goal of the Oneida Nation is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has established the Oneida Environmental Health & Safety Department to "provide services that preserve, restore, and enhance our environment, and protect and educate its people consistent with the culture, vision and priorities of the Oneida Nation", and
- WHEREAS, the Environmental Industrial Health Program has been delegated the responsibility to develop a comprehensive Tribal Air Quality Program, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin submits a grant application to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for a grant under Section 103 Air Quality Grant Program.
