RESOLUTION 9-27-76-6

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has for many years has fought an up hill battle for justice in our land dealings with our Trustee. (BIA)
- WHEREAS, 78 million dollars in the Indian Reorganization Act earmarked for land acquisition has never been appropriated.
- WHEREAS, much research has to be done on the historical status of Oneida land title in New York and/or Wisconsin.
- WHEREAS, the series of events and documents leading up to and including what transpired thereafter in the Indian Allotment Act of 1887 as it relates to the land problems of the Oneida Tribe to the present.
- WHEREAS, there are some 15,000 allotments in two counties that will require indepth title search by individuals who are instructed in the proper methods of title search.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby request the Development Association Inc., for the Technical Assistance services of Amos Hopkins in the Development of a Constitution and By-Laws that concur with our Tribal Treaties, and to assist in updating the Oneida Federal Corporate Charter which is also an important part of the Municipal Law under IRA, which the Tribe has chosen to operate. A Tribal tax structure must be laid out with guidelines that are equal to or better than the complete State Tax structure, laws, and codes. To research and the putting together the entire history of the Oneida Tribe through the Allotment Act of 1887 and set up viable proposals for economic advancement.
