## RESOLUTION # 10-01-97-B

Darlene Denny and Carmelita Escamea Resolution

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a Federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the Oneida tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, Darleen K. Denny, #1353 and Carmelita J. Escamea, #8004, a/are Tribal Member(s), have made application for a long-term lease for residential purposes; and

WHEREAS, Darleen K. Denny, #1353 and Carmelita J. Escamea, #8004, has/have been designated Lease No. RL-2908(97) for the Tribal land selected and is more particularly described as follows: 3767 Hillcrest Drive, Green Bay, WI 54313.

Part of Government Lot 9, Section 25, T24N-R19E, Town of Hobart, Brown County, Wisconsin, Fourth Principal Meridian, more fully described as follows:

Commencing at the Northeast corner of Government Lot 9, Section 25, T24N-R19E; thence S89°27'52"W, 275.01 feet along the north line of said Lot 9 to the point of beginning; thence S00°02'30"E, 100.00 feet; thence S67°00'03"W, 172.00 feet; thence N43°05'53"W, 225.00 feet; thence N89°27'52"E, 312.00 feet along the north line of Government Lot 9, said Section; to the point of beginning.

Parcel contains 33,772 square feet/0.78 acres, more or less. Subject to easements of records.

A 33' wide ingress/egress easement being located in -

Part of Government Lot 9, Section 25, T24N-R19E, town of Hobart, Brown County, Wisconsin, Fourth Principal Meridian, and whose C/L is more fully described as follows:

Commencing at the Northeast corner of Government Lot 9, Section 25, T24N-R19E; thence S89°27'52"W, 32.64 feet to the west right-of-way of C.T.H. "FF", also known as Hillcrest Drive; thence S0°13'44"W, 116.51 feet along said right-of-way to the point of beginning; thence continuing S89°27'52"W, 281.59 feet along the centerline of a 33 foot ingress/egress easement to the point of ending.

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin's Division of Land Management is responsible for managing all tribal real property assets, including leases, through rules and policies approved in Oneida Real Property Law; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by this Committee in <u>Regular</u> assembled, hereby requests the Superintendent, Great Lakes Agency, to draft a lease in accordance with the Act of August 9, 1955 (69 Stat, 539), as amended, 25 USC 415, for the above-described land with a 25 year term which shall automatically and without notice renew for an additional term of 25 years at a total rental, \$1.00 per year or \$50 for fifty years, at a total rental to be determined by an appraisal, and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary of the Oneida Business Committee are hereby authorized to execute lease documents for and on behalf of the Oneida Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Christine M. Doxtator, Land Management Director, or her designee, be authorized to execute said lease agreement on behalf of the Oneida Tribe.
