WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe maintains a deep concern over the child welfare services provided by the State of Wisconsin and its political subdivisions to Indian families.

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe is organized in accordance with the provisions of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Statute 984), and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin Indian Family Services, Ins. has prepared a proposal for BIA Child Welfare monies which would permit this organization to advocate these concerns with the Department of Health and Social Services, State of Wisconsin.

WHEREAS, the Great Lakes Inter-Tribal Council, Inc. has endorsed and supports this proposal of Wisconsin Indian Family Services, Inc. to the Bureau of Indian Affairs on
