BC Resolution # 10-06-04-A

Bonding Requirement for Certain Types of Employment

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the General Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe currently requires all employees to be bondable under the Oneida Tribe's fidelity bond; and
- WHEREAS,** a bond is required to cover the Oneida Tribe against potential losses caused by employee actions; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee believes that a bonding requirement should only be required for positions which have access to large amounts money or other assets.


NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that positions which handle, control, or have access to monies or other assets that meet or exceed the deductible for the Tribe's fidelity bond shall require that the individual employed in that position be bondable under the Tribe's fidelity bond.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that resolution is not intended to affect the background or licensing requirements applicable to employees under Tribal, Federal, or State law.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the Human Resources Department is hereby authorized to develop a standard operating procedure to implement this resolution.
