

## FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE AIRPORT AGREEMENT (CASINO ROAD)

WHEREAS,	the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America, and
WHEREAS,	the Oneida General Tribe Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
WHEREAS,	the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
WHEREAS,	Article IV, Section 1 (h) authorizes the Oneida Business Committee "to charter subordinate organizations for economic purposes", and
WHEREAS,	the Oneida Business Committee granted a Corporate Charter to the Oneida Airport Business Development Corporation ("Corporation") on August 25, 1993, and
WHEREAS,	the Corporation has a lease with Austin Straubel International Airport for a parking area in which the Oneida Nation had signed a Guaranty which is effective only in the event the Corporation is dissolved or unable to function, and
WHEREAS,	the Corporation desires to amend said lease to include a road near the intersection of Airport Road and South Point Road, commonly known as the "casino road", and
WHEREAS,	the Oneida Nation desires to act as Guarantor for said First Amendment to the Airport Lease Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee approves the First Amendment to the Airport Lease Agreement as the Guarantor and authorizes two of four of its officers to execute said amendment and bind the Oneida Nation as Guarantor to said amendment.

## CERTIFICATION
