RESOLUTION # 10-12-90-A

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and,

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has supported the mission goals, and objectives of the Oneida Nation Museum, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin recognizes the need to not only preserve but to share our culture with others in the surrounding communities and beyond, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has recognized the importance of, and the contributions made by local artists to the preservation of our culture, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin seeks to present educational programs to tribal and non-tribal members by promoting local Oneida artists.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin submit application to the National Endowment of the Arts Program, in support of the Oneida Nation Museum and its programs.
