BC Resolution 10-13-10-A

Resolution in Support of Ron "Tehassi" Hill Jr. Serving on the Wisconsin Bioenergy Council

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council; and

WHEREAS, the WI Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection would like to appoint Council Member Tehassi Hill to serve on the Bioenergy Council to serve as a representative of Wisconsin Tribes; and

WHEREAS, the Bioenergy Council is found in Wisconsin Statute 93.47 which specifies that the Council "shall identify voluntary best management practices for sustainable biomass and biofuels production, which may include consideration of practices related to choosing biomass species, where to plant, crop management, harvest, and processing and transport, and factors such as soil management, chemical inputs, carbon sequestration in soil and root mass, plant and animal biodiversity, and other factors at the discretion of the council. The council shall consider efforts relating to sustainable biomass and biofuels production conducted by other entities, including the council on forestry."

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Oneida Business Committee hereby supports Council Member Tehassi Hill's appointment to the Bioenergy Council.
