1. In order for HUD to continue processing the CDBG application for land acquisition the attached resolution should be adopted. HUD has put a October 16 deadline for submission.
2. I request authorization to attend a three day work session/meeting with Great Lakes Inter-Tribal Council Planners and Tribal Chairmen, Monday night October 22 through Thursday October 25 at Beccher, Wisconsin. Expenses will be paid through the balance of state contract administration funds. (CETA)
3. It has now been 30 days since the proposed Comprehensive Plan was discussed formally by the Business Committee. I am prepared to continue this discussion tonight or set up a special meeting should the Committee desire.

RESOLUTION MAKING CERTAIN DESIGNATIONS
AND ASSURANCES FOR THE COMMUNITY
DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, Inc.
(applicant)

has been invited by Department of Housing and Urban
Development) to submit a full application for a grant to
fund certain eligible Community Development Block Grant
Program activities and in connection with such application
must resolve and make certain designations and assurances;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- (1) Applicant possesses the legal authority to apply
for the grant and carry out the eligible activities
being funded by such grant.
- (2) Applicant has duly authorized filing of the
application and has designated Purcell Powless
(Tribal Chairperson)
as the official representative of applicant to sign,
file and otherwise act in connection with the
application and to provide any additional information
required.
- (3) Prior to submission of the full application, the
governing body of the applicant has satisfied the
requirement for citizen participation specified in
CFR 571.305(e)(3) and has so resolved in the
resolution submitted with its preapplication.
- (4) The Chief Executive Officer or other official of
the applicant approved by Department of Housing and
Urban Development:
 - (i) Consents to assume the status of a responsible
Federal official under the National Environmental
Policy Act of 1969 insofar as the provisions of
such Act apply to the applicant's proposed
program pursuant to 24 CFR 571.602, and
 - (ii) Is authorized and consents on behalf of the
applicant and him/her self to accept the
jurisdiction of the Federal Courts for the
purpose of enforcement of his/her responsibilities
as such an Official.

- (5) The program has been developed principally to benefit low- and moderate-income persons.
- (6) It will comply with the regulations of FIC 74-4 and OMB Circular A-102 as they apply to applicants under this Part.
- (7) It will administer and enforce the labor standards requirements prescribed by these regulations.
- (8) It will comply with the requirements of Title II of Public Law 90-284 (25 U.S.C. 1301) (the Indian Civil Rights Act).
- (9) It will comply with the Indian Preference provisions required in §571.507 of these regulations.
- (10) It will establish written safeguards to prevent employees from using positions funded under this section for a purpose that is, or gives appearance of being, motivated by private gain for themselves or their close family or business associates. Nothing in this certification should be construed as to limit employees from benefiting from program activities for which they would otherwise be eligible.
- (11) It will give the Department of Housing and Urban Development and the Comptroller General access to and right to examine all books, records, papers or documents related to the grant for a period of no less than three years after project completion.
