RESOLUTION #10-19-83-A

- WHEREAS, The Oneida Headstart Program is small in size as are most of the Indian and Alaskan Native Head Start Programs; and,
- WHEREAS, The Oneida Head Start Program has an ongoing mission to train staff and parents in all component parts of the Head Start Performance Standards as do all Indian and Alaskan Native Head Start Programs; and,
- WHEREAS, The major coordination of such services as well as the provision of Handicap services has been accomplished by the Offices of Indian Child Services network; and,
- WHEREAS, The Oneida Head Start Program has frequently participated in the training and technical assistance offered by the Minnesota Office of Indian Child Services; and
- WHEREAS, The Oneida Head Start Program has found the training and technical assistance provided by the Minnesota Office of Indian Child Services to be good and cost effective; and,
- WHEREAS, The proposed concept of a single resource center to the diverse needs of all Indian and Alaskan Native Head Start Programs appears too cumbersome and geographically inadequate.
- NOW, THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is in support of the continuation of the network of offices of Indian Child Services for the benefit of the Indian Headstart Families and Head Start Staffs.
- LET IT BE FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians continues to support the concept of a Great Lakes' Consortium made up of Minnesota and Wisconsin Indian Head Start Programs for the purpose of Training and Technical Assistance through the Minnesota Office of Indian Child Services as outlined in our correspondence dated April 20, 1983.
