## REGARDING PARDON OF BRANDON STEVENS

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV., Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Pardon Screening Committee has presented a Pardon Petition on behalf of BRANDON STEVENS, and

WHEREAS, the requirements of the Oneida Pardon Ordinance and Oneida Pardon Procedures Policy have been fulfilled, and


WHEREAS, the Oneida Pardon Screening Committee hereby recommends APPROVING the pardon petition of BRANDON STEVENS, Petitioner.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee by this resolution hereby:

√ **GRANTS** the Pardon of BRANDON STEVENS, Petitioner and notifies the Oneida Nation and its employing agencies that the Petitioner is recognized as a member of the Oneida Nation to have all the benefits and employment opportunities available to all other persons as if the criminal past pardoned by this resolution did not exist.

**CERTIFICATION**

I, the undersigned, as Secretary of the Oneida Business Committee, hereby certify that the Oneida Business Committee is composed of 9 members of whom 5 members constitute a quorum. 5 members were present at a meeting duly called, noticed and held on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of October 2007; that the foregoing resolution was duly adopted at such meeting by a vote of 4 members for; 0 members against, and 0 members not voting; and that said resolution has not been rescinded or amended in any way.
