Resolution # <u>10-29-97-X</u> Resolution Adopting Amended Election Law

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Election Board has received comments and suggestions to make elections run more smoothly from start to finish, and
- WHEREAS, the Election Board has presented an amended Election Law based on these comments regarding election processes to the Legislative Operating Committee which has presented the amended law at Public Hearing, and
- WHEREAS, the Election Board has presented the amended document at Community Meetings to gather the greatest input from the membership and has made changes based on the comments at the Public Hearings and Community Meetings,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the General Tribal Council hereby adopts the attached Election Law for immediate implementation upon adoption, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Election Board shall present a process for staggering the membership of the Election Board to the Oneida Business Committee within 30 days of adoption of this amended law to post for the open positions created by adoption of this amended law.
