RESOLUTION NO. 11-3-75-2

PERTAINING TO THE NEED FOR RE-ESTABLISHING PRIORITIES IN OB-TAINING EXCESS AND/OR SURPLUS EQUIPMENT FOR INDIAN ACTION TEAM PROGRAMS.

- WHEREAS, the Indian Action Teams of the three state area of Michigan, Wisconsin and Minnesota badly need excess and/or surplus government equipment of every kind in order to develop workable construction management and select training capabilities on a local level, and
- WHEREAS, present policy of the General Services Administration (GSA) has placed the priorities of Native American Programs in obtaining good useable GSA equipment at a very low level, inversely representing the needs of the Native Americans, now therefore be it
- RESOLVED, that the Directors of the Indian Action Teams in the states of Michigan, Wisconsin and Minnesota urge the Congressional Delegations from the three states to give necessary support and assistance in a asking the General Services Administration to reconsider and re-establish its priority policy in order to more meaningfully meet the needs of the Native Americans.
