RESOLUTION NO. 72-11-6 H

WHEREAS, education is the top priority of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, education is the top priority of all the Tribes in the Great Lakes Agency as well as nationally and,

WHEREAS, all Bureau of Indian Affairs funds are allocated in rigid line items, and

WHEREAS, the Great Lakes Agency has a pressing need for supplementary funds to meet the requests of the Indian students in Employment Assistance, (Voc-Tech) Adult Education, and College scholarships and,

WHEREAS Employment Assistance funds are needed in the following catagories:

> Adult Voc. Tech. Training \$300,000

WHEREAS the need for supplementary funds for college scholarships and Adult Education are as follows:

College Scholarships\$75,000 Adult Education 25,000 Total\$100,000

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that in keeping with President Nixon's Indian policy of self-determination, that supplementary funds be approprimated in the amount of five hundred and fifteen thousand (\$515,000) dollars for the B.I.A. Education Programs in the Great Lakes Agency in Ashland, Wisconsin.
