
## Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin

## **RESOLUTION #11-09-94-A**

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has determined that the overall goal of the Oneida Nation is to protect, maintain and improve the standards of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe also states that as part of the mission of the 7th generation Committment, the Oneida Tribe is committed to providing "for the quality of life where the people come together for the common good", and
- WHEREAS, it is known that there is no artificial substitute for blood, therefore the American Red Cross must collect blood from volunteer donors, and
- WHEREAS, it has been determined that there is a great need for our Native American people to come together for the good of giving blood for the purpose of satisfying the need for close matches in racial or ethnic grouping, and
- WHEREAS, studies have shown that people will give blood if it is convenient for them and if their friends or coworkers are giving.
- NOW THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin will hereby host a year-long blood drive in which those Tribal employees who give blood at least four (4) times within that year will incur eight hours of vacation time which may be accumulated

## **CERTIFICATION**
