- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is extremely concerned and supportive of the education of its members, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin recognizes that Oneida Youth are the future leaders of the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians watches over its next seven generations, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has demonstrated the ability to work with the cultural and educational needs of the Oneida Community.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin apply for a Youth Enrichment Center grant from the Department of Health and Human Services 1989 Discretionary Funds Program.
