WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is extremely concerned and supportive of the education of its members, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin recognizes that Oneida Youth are the future leaders of the Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians watches over its next seven generations, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has demonstrated the ability to work with the cultural and educational needs of the Oneida Community.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin apply for a Youth Enrichment Center grant from the Department of Health and Human Services 1989 Discretionary Funds Program.
