- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has identified Education and Health as two of our national priorities, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin continues to support the health of Oneida youth through offering services that will enrich our youths self esteem and provide character building activities, such as recreational programs, so they may thrive today and in their future endeavors, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin submits a grant application to the Women's Sports Council for the Tampax Grants for Girls to continue on-going efforts of the Oneida Nation School System for the Pom-Pom Squad and a Girls Softball Team.
