Special meeting called at CCC Camp by Ch. Julius Danforth at request of Mr. Riley.

Council discussed to property of Mrs. Rebecca Skenandore in regards to her releasing the property in favor of her niece Alfrieda Helen Bratten. Mr. Riley at this time explained that whoever would want the house would have to make application for such, building (unreadable) loan agreement drawn (unreadable) He also explained to (unreadable) that there is no way the welfare department could collect from Mrs. Bratten, but Mr. Steve Skenandore could not release the house or property to anyone but the Tribe. Robert Thomas was at meeting to inquire about going to school. Mr. Riley informed him that Mr. McLead will be coming out soon and he will inform us of this.

Mr. Riley also explained to Percill Elm (?) heir of (unreadable) only entitled to personal property involved in the insurance on this estate. It was explained that the insurance on house will go to Tribe.

Mr. Riley introduced Mr. Holmberg who spoke on possibilities of industrial industry on or near Indian reservations.

1. Find out if Seymour has a group active in Industrial Development Appoint committee of 5-6 to be on Industrial Development Committee.
2. General Tribal Council at Jan. or July meeting could by a vote of a quorum empower Executive Committee to act in this regard. Could advertise as to land acreage available.

Discussion held on Joe Skenandore house. Mr. Riley suggested that Mrs. Adams try to get loan on bond or try to find another buyer with permission of Tribal Council if she doesn't make some arrangement. Otherwise they can move house off the land. Riley reported to council he met at a meeting in Denver with Mr. Nash discussed ways of helping Indian groups to help themselves develop their resources. Mr. Riley suggested leasing land that isn't being used (?education).

Congress (?) passed 14 of its 20 million dollar appropriation and all this has been over committed.

No other business at this time. Meeting adjourned.
