

RESOLUTION # <u>11-29-95-G</u>

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, Faye A. Cleveland, a tribal member, and Darryl V. Cleveland, Sr., a non-member, have made application for a long-term lease for residential purposes; and

WHEREAS, the tribal land selected is described as follows:

Lot 8, Standing Stone Subdivision, located within SW¼NE¼ Section 3, Township
23 North, Range 19 East, Brown County, Wisconsin, containing .40 acres, more
or less.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by this Committee in Regular session assembled, hereby requests the Superintendent, Great Lakes Agency, to draft a lease in accordance with the he Act of August 9, 1955 (69 Stat. 539), as amended, 25 USC 415, for the above-described land with a 25 year term which shall automatically and without notice renew for an additional therm of 25 years at a total rental of \$1.00 annually or \$50.00 for 50 years; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary of the Oneida Business Committee are hereby authorized to execute lease documents for and on behalf of the Oneida Tribe.
