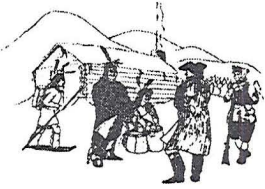


Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin

Resolution 12-08-10-A

Extension of Emergency Amendments to the Zoning and Shoreland Protection Law

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the General Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS,** the Zoning and Shoreland Protection Law (the Law) governs the development of Tribal land in order to protect the character and stability of residential, commercial, industrial, agricultural, and other areas within the Reservation, and to assure the orderly and beneficial development of such areas; and
- WHEREAS,** the Law does not have any requirements to uniformly maintain building numbers and provide for easy identification of those numbers; and
- WHEREAS,** fire and rescue services depend on these building numbers during an emergency; and
- WHEREAS,** Resolution BC-06-23-10-G amended the Law on an emergency basis to add uniform building numbering standards to the Law; and
- WHEREAS,** the Administrative Procedure Act (APA) authorizes the Oneida Business Committee to enact legislation on an emergency basis, to be in effect for a period of six (6) months, renewable for an additional six (6) months; and
- WHEREAS,** extension of the emergency adoption of the amendments to the Law is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare of the reservation population, and that observance of the regular APA adoption requirements for passage of laws would be contrary to public interest.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the attached amendments to the Zoning and Shoreland Protection law are hereby extended on an emergency basis for an additional six months after the original emergency amendment expires.

CERTIFICATION
