## BC Resolution #12-10-08-C

Resolution to Adopt the Seventh Amendment to the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin Retirement Savings & 401(k) Plan

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee previously adopted the amended and restated Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin Retirement Savings and 401(k) Plan (the "401(k) Plan"), and
- WHEREAS, legal counsel has recommended that the 401(k) Plan be amended to incorporate additional compliance language required under Internal Revenue Code Section 415 (limiting maximum annual benefits) and additional language regarding the Tribe's reasonable and good faith operational compliance with the Pension Protection Act of 2006 (the "PPA"), and
- WHEREAS, the Seventh Amendment to the 401(k) Plan, including the required Code Section 415 compliance language and the PPA operational good faith provisions, has been prepared and is being presented to the Business Committee this date.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Seventh Amendment to the 401(k) Plan is hereby adopted, confirmed and ratified by the Oneida Business Committee in the form presented for its approval this date.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Oneida Business Committee Chair is authorized and directed to execute the Seventh Amendment to the Plan on behalf of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, together with such legal and technical changes as may be recommended by legal counsel and deemed to be in the best interests of the Tribe.

**BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED,** that the actions taken by Tribal officers and personnel in connection with the matters addressed in these resolutions be, and hereby are, ratified, confirmed and adopted as actions of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.

## **CERTIFICATION**
