## RESOLUTION # 12-13-95-B

WHEREAS the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as: RANDY J. KUENTJES AND SUZANNE M. KUENTJES, 3334 W. MASON STREET, GREEN BAY, WI, TAX PARCEL # 6H-759-3

WHEREAS the parcel is described as follows

TOWNSHIP THAT PART OF LOT SEVENTEEN (17), IN SECTION TWENTY-FIVE (25), TWENTY-FOUR (24) NORTH, RANGE NINETEEN (19) EAST, IN THE FOURTH PRINCIPLE MERIDIAN, LYING NORTH OF STATE HIGHWAY 54, AS PRESENTLY LAIDOUT, IN THE CITY OF GREEN BAY, WEST SIDE OF FOX RIVER, BROWN COUNTY, WISCONSIN, DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS:

COMMENCING AT THE NE CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST QUARTER OF THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER (SW 1/4 OF SE 1/4) OF SAID SECTION 25 AND RUNNING WEST ALONG THE NORTH BOUNDARY LINE OF THE SW 1/4 TO THE NORTH BOUNDARY LINE OF STATE HIGHWAY 54 AS NOW LOCATED; THENCE SOUTHWEST ALONG THE NORTH BOUNDARY LINE OF SAID HIGHWAY 54 FOR A DISTANCE OF 872 FEET TO THE PLACE OF BEGINNING OF THE PROPERTY TO BE HEREIN DESCRIBED; THENCE NORTHWEST ON A LINE PERPENDICULAR TO THE NORTH LINE OF SAID HIGHWAY FOR A DISTANCE OF 16 RODS FROM THE CENTER LINE OF SAID HIGHWAY 54; THENCE NORTHEAST ON A LINE PARALLEL WITH THE CENTER LINE OF SAID HIGHWAY TO THE EAST LINE OF SAID LOT 17; THENCE SOUTH ALONG THE EAST BOUNDARY LINE OF SAID LOT 17 TO THE NORTH LINE OF STATE HIGHWAY 54; THENCE ALONG THE NORTH BOUNDARY LINE OF STATE HIGHWAY 54 TO THE PLACE OF BEGINNING.


