Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.



Lot 1 of the certified survey map recorded in Volume 8, Page 19, Certified Survey Maps, Brown County Records, EXCEPTING THEREFROM the Northerly 50.0 feet; being part of Lots 10 and 11, Section 30, Township 24 North, Range 20 East, City of Green Bay, Brown County, Wisconsin.

WHEREAS, The above described parcel is requested in trust status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide future housing sites, and

WHEREAS, The Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs to initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcel in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.
