WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the government body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section I of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the Onayote?aká Repatriation Program (ORP) has been delegated the responsibility to preserve and protect the cultural and historical concerns of the Oneida Community, and

WHEREAS, the ORP in fulfilling these responsibilities has been pursuing outside funding sources including the Wisconsin Humanities Council Grant for an oral history project


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:
