

A special meeting of the Executive board was called October 29, 1937 at 9:00 o'clock at the home of Lydia Powless. Majority members present. The purpose of this meeting was to hear about land assignments as to sizes of lots to be granted. It was explained by the Chairman that these would have to be temporary assignments as we did not obtain the quorum at meetings necessary, to make business legal and permanent.

Henry Skenandore's application was first considered as fit to handle LaBotts farm of 40 acres with buildings. He has 3 horses seven cows and all implements, and he prefers to move in the spring. Members voted in favor. It was decided to take in a bunch of applications before calling for tribal council for approval, if a quorum would be present.

C. Adams made a motion that Henry Skenandore's application be subject for approval as well as others that come in.

Harrison Smith made a motion and was seconded that a ten acre wood lot be reserved across the road from Norman Schauman's place majority voted in favor.

Henry Skenandore motioned and was seconded that Oneida Indians be allowed to get from any tribal land two loads of wood, dead wood, not to cut down any green timber, and permit to be issued by the Secretary.

The chairman suggests to put up signs prohibiting hunting by white men.

The meeting adjourned at 10:30
