MINUTES

A special meeting was called by Chairman Julius Danforth to act on a bill in Congress termed "Operation Bootstrap" at the request of Representative M.Y. Berry from S. Dak. and also to get things lined up for the 204-wor on May 23, 29, and 30th.

After much discussion on the bill, council decided that they would not take any action at this time as this committee has been working on many of the things that were being stressed to no avail. The bill which favored Industrial development in and near Indian reservations, plus other benefits for American- Indians some-how doesn't seem to apply to Oneidas as far as this committee can figure, as after we had an survey made here many of these things were brought up.

Council discussed the need for local law enforcement and decided they would have the board take action to get a deputy in line for Foxboro.

A motion was made by Irene Moore for the Committee to make the necessary arrangements to have Leslie Danforth deputized. Seconded by Althea Schuyler. Carried.

Motion was made by Althea Schuyler that the Tribe would pay the necessary expenses involved in securing a badge etc. Seconded by Eva Danforth. Carried.

Motion was made by Irene Moore to hire Lester Schuyler to take care of the necessary wiring and electrical repairs at the CCC grounds. Seconded by Eva Danforth. Carried.

Leslie Danforth reported to the Committee that August Form had an out-house in fairly good repair that the Tribe could purchase for \$15.

Motion was made by Eva Danforth to buy the 112g. for \$15. and to have William Carmel deliver same at CCC grounds. Seconded by Irene Moore. Carried.

After the business of evening of the evening was over Council had an informal meeting with Mr. Walter Taylor from the Division of Children and Youth in Green Bay. Mr. Taylor reported that he didn't think they was much chance of the Tribe getting a recreational instructor here in Oneida as planned, as it would be up to the tribe to finance any personnel. We also discussed leaving up a charter for the recreational committee in Oneida and Mrs. Irene Moore volunteered to get things lined up for a meeting at her house for this purpose.

Meeting adjourned at 11:00 PM May 26, 1960.
