Special meeting held at CCC building to help explain the P.H.A.

Low Rent housing groups

Self-help built on individual lands

Recommended for elderly, widows, renting

Authority over-see and decide policies

Federal government makes up difference between rent collected and total expenses per year.

Self-help direct loan to housing authority

Tribal Council elect Housing Authority appoints

Housing Authority to follow model transcript for organization carefully

Housing Authority must have approved of governing body to borrow money – in this case the tribal council.

FHA is unsubsidized and there is interest charge

PHA is subsidized

PHA will hire skilled labor not available in tribal members

Divide questionnaire between self-help and rental program

Tribal H.A. can only operate on tribal lands.

Baraga Mich. Public H. Program

Appoint

1. Planning Commission – zoning on tribal land a – would not have control over tax land and not under approved workable program. (Mr. Ventura will inquire about it)
2. Citizens Participation Committee – clean up and fix

Suggested we ask for law rental housing for old age and widows and self-help housing prepare workable program and ask someone to come here to help fill out forms after ordinance is passed.
