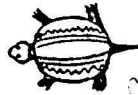


Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.

Loretta Ellis moved for adoption of the revised application form on Tribal letterhead. Eva Danforth second. Motion carried.
