Norbert Hill, Sr., Tribal Manager and Margaret Doxtator, Secretary were absent.

This meeting concerned Sonny King and the ONAP Program. Sonny King gave his report and asked for a raise in salary. No action was taken. He also reported the following people as being on the Board of Directors of the Boys' Club, which is being organized:
