Ernie Stevens made a presentation of a copy and the original annuity roll and also a copy of the original allotment plats

There was information and general discussion on the Seminary:

1. Quit Claim Deed
2. The unauthorized closing of the Tribal Government school in 1919.
3. The arbitrary sale of Tribal property to the Green Bay diocese; without proper bidding or Tribal consent.
4. The illegal allotting of Oneida Patent lands.
5. Article 4 of the 1838 Treaty.
6. The Bryan Case.

Meeting was adjourned at 10:30 p.m
